The Program

“Girls of Promise” is the longest running program initiative of the Women’s Foundation of Arkansas. Since the first conference held at UALR in 2000, this initiative has expanded to eight sites around the state and introduced thousands of 8th grade girls to information about careers related to economics, science, technology, engineering and math (ESTEM) while giving them the opportunity to meet with women professionals for greater understanding of their own potential and power. These events have encouraged girls to pursue academic excellence in their high school and college years.



The “Girls of Promise” program aims to encourage girls at a time in their life when they tend to lose interest in science. Eighth grade is a pivotal age when girls begin to internalize negative stereotypes that discourage academic achievement and denigrate those who do not conform to peer expectations and social pressures. These conferences congratulate girls for their current success and future potential, and give girls the chance to visualize what they can become if they aim high and continue to achieve. What’s more, when girls hear from women in these roles they see that - with hard work and support - careers in these fields are attainable and rewarding.

Girls of Promise 2011

Five conferences were held in 2011, reaching 361 young women across the state. Eight conferences are scheduled for 2012. Post-conference evaluations completed by students, chaperones and volunteers all speak to a successful conference series. To quote one chaperone: “I will remember the speakers in break-out sessions - hearing from women of diverse career and cultural backgrounds. They are great role models - intelligent, beautiful, and inspiring women. I loved how specific the breakout speakers were about their education & the actual pathway to their careers; personal stories are so powerful. The keynote speaker was amazing! How wonderful this organization is to encourage young girls to pursue careers in STEM.”

The acclaim “Girls of Promise” enjoys in the local communities hosting the conferences has enabled the Foundation to draw highly qualified professional women as speakers and role models year after year. This year’s conferences utilized the talents of inspirational speaker Mrs. Ginger Beebe, First Lady of Arkansas and keynote speakers Dr. Janet Ply, Managing Partner of Pendere, Inc; Dr. Anousheh Ansari, Co-Founder & Chief Executive Officer, Prodea Systems; Sarah Tipton, Meteorologist KAIT-TV; Amber Straughn, Nasa Postdoctoral Fellow, NASA Goddard Space Flight Center; and Ms. Jessica Keahey, Project Engineer/Manager, McGoodwin, Williams, & Yates.

Each year, in addition to the keynote speakers, more than 30 speakers may be utilized for the break-out sessions for the girls. Teams of girls attend four break-out sessions each, allowing them to be introduced to all of the ESTEM fields. Break-out sessions are structured so that the speakers not only share their work verbally, but engage the young women in a hands-on exercise to involve them more deeply in the intricacies of that speaker’s particular profession. This year conference attendees engaged in activities such as dissecting calf eyes, zapping cancer cells, and conducting field surveys of a creek running through the campus. The “Speaker Extravaganza” at each conference gives the girls the opportunity to visit with all of the speakers presenting at the conferences, not just those to whose sessions they were assigned. This is a popular activity, giving the girls time to move around freely and interact one-on-one with the presenters.

The women volunteering for the conferences carry their own credentials – corporate business-women, UAMS students, bank executives, corporate and non-profit board members and so on. The concentration of women succeeding and/or pursuing careers in the ESTEM fields present at this - and past - year’s conferences visibly

demonstrates the over-arching message that women CAN and DO succeed in careers involving economics, math, science, technology and engineering. Presenters at each conference are listed under each site name in this report.



Ultimately, the conferences are about the young women attending. Pre-conference surveys paint pictures of small-town young women with small-views of career opportunities for those interested in the STEM fields. When asked if they knew women in these fields, the overwhelming response was no. Second in the list of responses to this question was either “math teacher” or “science teacher”. It is no wonder that the vast majority of girls in Arkansas do not pursue the myriad career opportunities utilizing STEM disciplines.

Post-conference surveys paint a much different portrait of these same young women. A sampling of responses:

“It was the best way to learn more things about the opportunities of careers and the many ways to make a lifetime of friends. Thank you for letting me explore new things and ideas and also, this conference helped me have confidence in myself to meet new people and do different things.”

“I met new people and learned how people from small towns can rise up and follow their dreams. That it doesn’t matter where you are from as long as you are determined.

Conclusion

As we wrap-up another successful year providing “Girls of Promise” conferences around the state, the enthusiasm and passion for “Girls of Promise” continues to grow. The Women’s Foundation has trademarked the Girls of Promise program and developed a Girls of Promise “Tool Kit” as a way to expand the initiative into areas of the state where there is currently no programming – most notably the Southeast corner. The Tool Kit, for which WFA holds the copyright, was used by local committees for the first time during the 2010 conference season. It is reviewed and updated at the completion of each conference season.

WFA has learned over the 10 years of providing this program that there is a growing network of Arkansas women eager to join with WFA in helping turn the tide on the telling education statistics on the state of Arkansas women and girls through efforts such as “Girls of Promise”. WFA will work to grow the membership of all the local committees for the existing conferences and explore communities in which to offer a Girls of Promise program in future years.

The Women’s Foundation completed an ambitious research project in June, 2010, which will continue throughout the life of Girls of Promise. A cadre of volunteers helps conduct the research each summer following the conferences. Data from the past 11 years of Girls of Promise conferences has been entered into a database and previous year participants are contacted on an ongoing basis to determine the continuing impact of the program on their lives. This exciting data is available on the WFA website.

The State Girls of Promise committee comprised of board members and state community leaders and educators will continue to develop ways to better inform parents and girls of STEM opportunities available to them throughout

the state outside of the GoP program. This committee also leads the expansion planning for the program and seeks existing women's groups around the state to help conduct the conferences as a way to achieve WFA's goals of increasing the number of girls that remain in high school, graduate and pursue post-secondary education/training. Thanks to your support, the future remains bright for the Women's Foundation of Arkansas' Girls of Promise program.
